

Her mother, Wilma Bergmann Nobe, started writing her memories in a spiral notebook in 1980, long after they occurred. We are so glad she did because the entry below shows a connection to the family of Concordia Seminary's Dr. Tim Saleska when his grandfather, Rev. E.J. Saleska, was pastor of St. Salvator Lutheran Church, Venedy, Ill. Nobe helped babysit and clean for the family.

"My mother was born in 1917 and confirmed in 1930," Kastens explained in an email. "So her employment with the Saleska family was from shortly after her confirmation until age 20."

Saleska wrote, "I commonly hear stories from others about the Venedy days and treasure them all."

In the following journal entry, Helen is Nobe's sister, John is Saleska's father, and Miriam and Lois are his aunts. John Jasper was a neighborhood friend. We are grateful to Kastens for giving us all an opportunity to discover these cherished memories.

One winter Pastor Saleska was very sick, in the hospital for some time. I took Miriam home and we had her for a whole week. Lois was the oldest and a little harder to manage. But I thought the world of her.
